For ten weeks during the winter and spring, students 14 - 18 years of age will receive classroom instruction at Montclair State University followed by paid internships in the summer.

They may also receive counseling, and take personal


Funding Update

SSH/SSH-TANF Grant

For SSH/SSH-TANF Homeless Prevention services, fromSeptember 1, 2016 - March 31, 2017, MNDC provided back rentalassistance, as well as relocation and PSE&G assistance for 28 families in the amount of \$59,328.

To be eligible for assistance, households must fall within the Federal Poverty Guidelines that the government provides to MNDC and all CSBG agencies.
