Renovation of Park House at Wally Choice Center Begins



The Park House at the Wally Choice Community Center is getting an upgrade. Essex County Executive Joseph N. DiVincenzo, Jr. announced plans March 20 with work slated for completion by June so important programs for youth and seniors can continue. Montclair **Neighborhood Development Corporation Executive Director Albert Pelham said,** "We are very excited to see this building being renovated because it is well used by people of all ages in the community." MNDC uses it for many of its activities vear-round including the seniors program Do Drop In, Project Oasis, and

many events.

Upgrades include new fixtures in restrooms to meet current ADA codes; the kitchen will be modernized with new equipment; the ceiling and floor tiles will be replaced; upgraded HVAC, fire alarm and lighting systems; interior and exterior walls will be painted and refinished; and exterior lighting will be upgraded. The asphalt surface in front of the community center will be replaced with brick pavers and a new driveway onto Maple Avenue will be created so motorists do not have to drive through the park to reach the parking area. New landscaping will be installed.

Valentine Project at MNDC

Career **Development Institute** previously known as Project Life, is scheduled to begin on Friday, April 20. Students in our After School Program were busy with many activities this winter. For Black History Month they discussed Rosa Parks and made a tri-fold board art display of her life. They also wrote about how her actions impacted their lives to change what they are allowed to do today.

In Mr. Blaine's financial literacy class, students learned how budgets are created and reviewed the differences and benefits of savings and checking accounts. Mr. Blaine and Ms. Dunn challenged them to open a savings account and will give each student five dollars to add to their account.

The students went on a field trip to see *Black Panther* and enjoyed the movie very much. This will lead into our study of the history of African kings and queens and students will create crowns.

Mark your Calendar: Project Oasis will run July 5 - August 2

Registration for Summer Oasis will open on April 3 at 228 Bloomfield Avenue, Montclair. This free popular summer program for 9 to 18-year-olds will run from July 5 through August 2.

Students attend evening enrichment and tutorial sessions that are matched to their needs to improve their abilities in financial literacy, math, science, language arts, and life skills. They also divide into teams and enjoy competing against one another in basketball (a major attraction of this program). Tennis is also offered. 


Funding Update

MNDC was recently awarded \$110,000 for the SSH grant and \$270,827 for the CSBG grant. We are grateful for these important funds that allow MNDC to continue our work in the community.

<u>CSBG</u>, the Community Service Block Grant, provides funds to assist state and local communities like ours to reduce poverty, revitalize neighborhoods and empower low-income families to become fully self-sufficient.

MNDC also provides SSH/SSH-TANF Homeless Prevention services. The chart below shows our activity from September 1 - December 31, 2017. We were able to provide rental assistance for 26 families and back rental assistance, relocation, and PSE&G assistance in the amount of \$48,927.
